### The ABC’s of Testimony Sunday

Be **A**udible. Stand up. Speak Directly into the mic. *Say your name.*

Be **B**rief. Please share what God has done, but let’s try to be brief (2-3 minutes) so we can hear as many stories as possible.

Be **C**hrist-centered. Make much of Christ by doing your best to leave us with how great He is and what He’s done for you. Basically, we do want to know a little about you, but we want to hear a lot about what Jesus has done.

**We invite anyone—all ages, women, men, non-members, members—to share how God has recently been working in your life.**

*Remember, you can have a testimony of God’s sustaining grace even when your situation has not gotten any better...or maybe it’s even getting worse. But God is helping you press on—that is a testimony!*

The four gospels are a narrative of the heart of Christ. They show His compassion to sinners, and His glorious work in their place. If you only knew that heart as it is, you would lay your weary head on his bosom. Do not take up your time so much with studying your own heart as with studying Christ’s heart. For one look at yourself, take ten looks at Christ!
